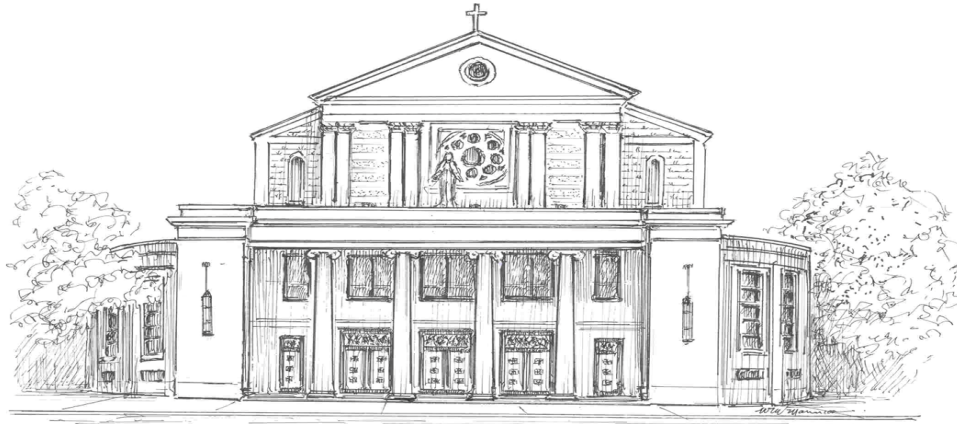

Corpus Christi - The Body and Blood of Christ

Each week, in fact, every day, we have the opportunity and the privilege available to us to receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Holy Communion. There is no greater gift than the presence of Christ Himself coming to us, to be part of us, part of our lives. It is an awesome gift and yet one, we probably take for granted, presuming He will always be there for us.

Jesus makes a promise to his followers and to us today as recalled in John's gospel. He says: "I am the living bread that comes down from heaven, whoever eats this bread will live forever and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Just as we need bread to keep our physical bodies alive, so too, we need the Eucharist, the bread of life; to keep our souls alive.

In a very real way, Jesus becomes one with us. Through our receiving the Eucharist, He is with us in the joys and challenges we face each day at school, at home or at work. As food gives our body strength, He, in communion, gives us strength and grace. He is always with us.

Adoration of Jesus in the Eucharist is an excellent way to become more aware of Jesus wanting to be close to us. Coming before Him, gives us peace and calm to listen to his voice and let Him be our true Shepherd. Rather than take this wonderful gift for granted, realize who comes to us in Communion and spend time with him in adoration in our chapel. In doing this, we will live, as Jesus promises, forever.

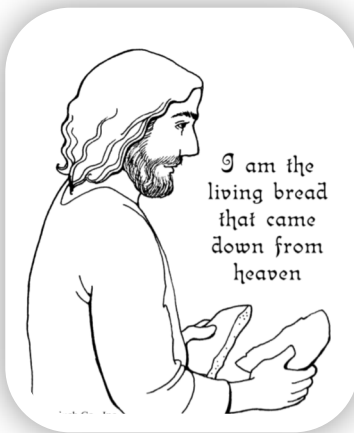
