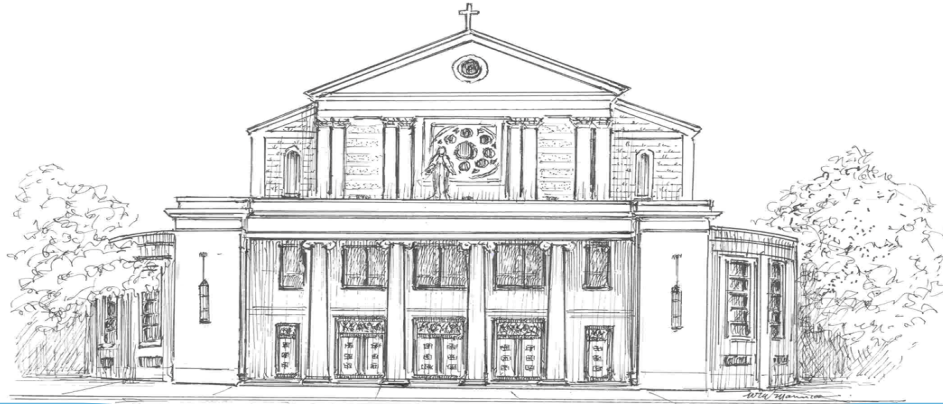

Brothers and sisters, you are children of the light

(1 Thessalonians 5:1-6).

Thirty -Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

God has blessed each of us with various gifts and talents. At times in our lives, we can be very clear about what those things are and how we can use them and, at other times, we can be confused as to what we have to offer. The readings today challenge us to take a good look at ourselves and see what gifts God has given us and how those gifts can be used and offered back to God not just for our own good but for the good of our brothers and sisters in Christ. How do we use our gifts to increase the spread of the gospel?

The first thing needed is for all of us to realize we have been given gifts by God, whether we are rich or poor; whether we think we are intelligent or were not so good in school; whether we believe we hold good jobs or are unemployed right now. No matter what our circumstances, we have all been gifted by God. He would not have made us if we were not. So, the challenge of the gospel is for us to realize what gifts we have to offer for the spread of the gospel.

The parable Jesus tells in the gospel today reminds us we can't take the talents or gifts we have and use them just for ourselves or hide them because we are afraid to speak about Jesus. Jesus talks about the master who gave his servants various amounts of money. Two invested them wisely while the third buried it until the master returned. The third was afraid of the master and so did nothing with what he was given. The master, on his return, took his money and gave it to one of the others.

We may not be given money by God but we've all be given the ability to speak about Jesus and to live the gospel in our daily lives. It takes courage to live our faith and in our society, it is not always convenient, yet this is what Jesus tells us today. If we do live our faith, it will continue to increase. If we do not, we will lose, as the gospel says, what little we have. Of all that could be given to us, the greatest gift is our faith. Jesus tells us today to realize that gift and use it to spread his message and he will welcome us into his kingdom!
