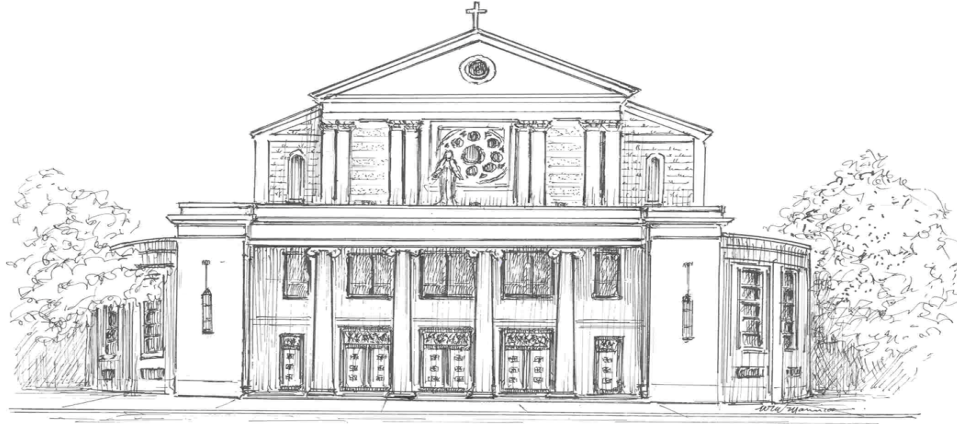

Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

Two great apostles are celebrated today, Peter and Paul. In some ways, they were very ordinary men. But they were called by Christ to do extraordinary things in His name.

Peter was a fisherman for a living. His brother Andrew heard Jesus and brought Peter to him. When Jesus was arrested, Peter denied he was a follower. In fact, he said he did not know him. He did not follow Jesus to the cross. Yet, he was the one chosen to be the leader of the new faith, the first Pope. Jesus saw in Peter his weaknesses but also his strengths. Peter would be a fiercely courageous leader of the church to the point of giving his life.

Paul's introduction to the faith was presiding over the stoning of Stephen, the first martyr. He fiercely persecuted the new Christians but then Jesus called him in a very dramatic way to preach about Him. Paul was chosen to bring the gospel to those who were not of the Jewish faith, the Gentiles. He traveled farther by foot and ship than many of us will in a lifetime. He was not afraid to speak the truth no matter the cost which for him too was eventually his life.

Peter and Paul both needed the forgiveness and mercy of Jesus but once received, they never looked back. They knew Jesus loved them and returned that love over and over. They worked miracles yet never allowed people to praise them but rather always pointed to Jesus Christ as we see in our readings today. We are ordinary people like Peter and Paul. We are sinners like Peter and Paul. Yet, we too, are given forgiveness by Jesus. He asks us to accept his love and go do the extraordinary work of proclaiming the Gospel with our lives.

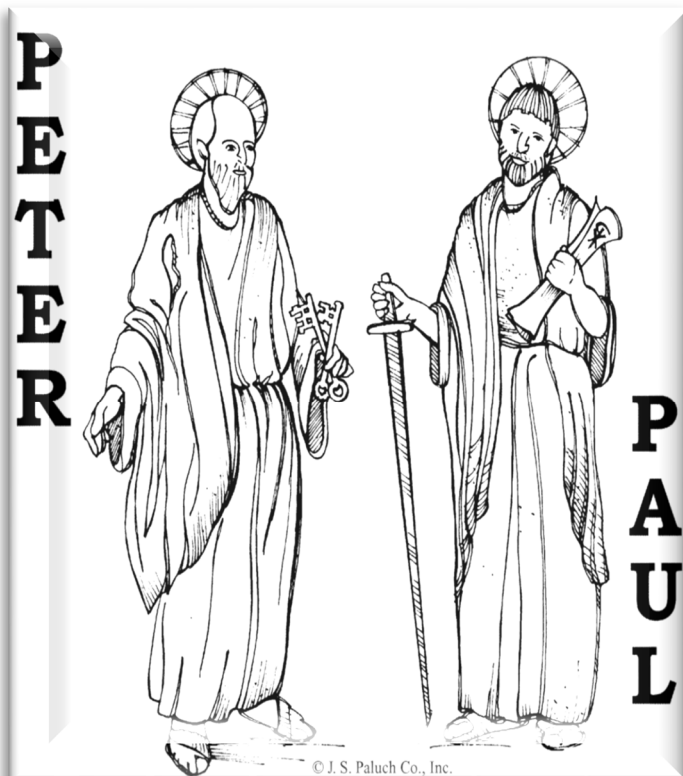
